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Cancellation policy: Please refer to the CPD Booklet for the full cancellation policy. In summary, all cancellations of course bookings must be made via email. Unfortunately, a phone call cannot be accepted as a means of cancellation. All bookings will remain on our system until written confirmation is received.

A charge of 35% (*) will normally be incurred if a delegate place is cancelled within 5 working days of the course date, with the full course fee being charged for any delegate who does not arrive for a course for which a place has been booked and not cancelled. In exceptional circumstances, where a course is running again within the same academic year, we will do our best to move delegates across to the next course date; however, where notification of non-attendance is received on the day of a face-to-face course, a £20 flat fee will be charged to cover the cost of refreshments, the venue and administration; this will be in addition to the full course fee when the delegate next attends that particular course.

For courses which are free of charge, any delegate failing to attend, and not cancelling their place in advance, will incur a £10 delegate fee (for online courses) to cover administration and a £20 delegate fee (for face-to-face courses) to cover refreshment and venue costs.

Whilst we will make every effort, we cannot guarantee to accommodate delegates on a course for which they have not booked a place.

In the event that a course has to be cancelled, we will endeavour to give 5 working days' notice of cancellation. Other than in the case of extreme adverse weather conditions, if a course is cancelled within 24 hours of the course start time, we will refund any supply costs incurred. Any claims must be made in writing and must be accompanied by full documentary evidence.

Digital technology is continually changing, and it is therefore essential that schools stay up to date with new developments.

Within the Ofsted framework online safety is included as an important part of a school's overall safeguarding responsibility, alongside the requirements set out in Keeping Children Safe in Education and the newly issued DFE guidance for use of mobile phones in schools.

Guidance for Ofsted inspectors to use when inspecting safeguarding under the common inspection framework outlines that, when assessing how effectively leaders and governors create a safeguarding culture in the setting, inspectors should consider evidence that:

- action is taken to ensure children are taught about safeguarding risks, including online risks
- staff, leaders and managers oversee the safe use of electronic and social media by staff and learners, and take immediate action if they are concerned about bullying or risky behaviours
- appropriate filters and monitoring systems are in place to protect learners from potentially harmful online material

Online safety is categorised into three main areas of risk:

Content: Children may be **exposed to illegal, inappropriate, or harmful material**. This includes:

- Pornography including AI generated material
- Racism, misogyny, anti-Semitism
- Self-harm or suicide content
- Extremism and radicalisation
- **Misinformation, disinformation and conspiracy theories** (explicitly strengthened in KCSIE 2025 updates)

Contact: Risks arising from **harmful interaction with others online**, such as:

- Peer-to-peer pressure
- Harmful or inappropriate commercial advertising
- Adults posing as children/young people
- Grooming for sexual, criminal, financial, or other exploitation

Conduct: Refers to **how the child behaves online**, potentially causing or increasing risk of harm, including:

- Online bullying
- Making, sending or receiving explicit images (including nudes/semi-nudes)
- Oversharing personal information
- Viewing or sharing pornography

Commerce: Risks relating to **financial harm or commercial exploitation**, such as:

- Online gambling
- Inappropriate advertising
- Phishing
- Financial scams or fraudulent in-game purchases

Health & Wellbeing Audits



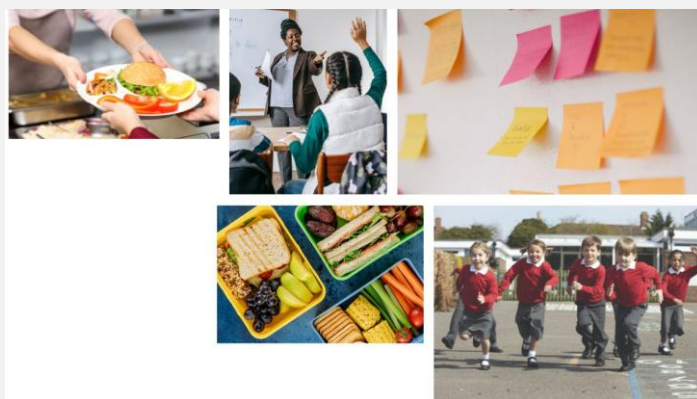
Do you find that you're not sure where the gaps are in your health and wellbeing offer? Or are you struggling for ideas on what you should focus on next?

We have created an audit for primary and secondary schools to complete to identify the areas you are covering well in health and wellbeing and also where there may be some gaps or areas for development in your offer. The items on the audit cover the topics of physical activity, food & nutrition and school ethos & culture.

When you access the audit, you will also be given access to a shared folder with the team so that we are able provide you with resources and tools to help you in the areas you may not currently have provision for. The audit will be a live document that you can start and come back to, and you will have continued access to, to be able to update the work you are doing in school. You are also able to have multiple members of staff have access to the folder, so it doesn't have to be the responsibility of just one person.

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Terms and conditions

CANCELLATION POLICY

All cancellations of course bookings must be made via email. Unfortunately a phone call cannot be accepted as a means of cancellation. All bookings will remain on our system until written confirmation of cancellation is received.

A charge of 35% will be incurred if a delegate place is cancelled within 5 working days of the course, with the full fee being charged for any delegate who does not arrive for a course for which a place has been booked and not cancelled. In exceptional circumstances, where a course is running again within the same academic year, we will do our best to move delegates across to the next course date. However, where notification of non-attendance is received on the day of a face to face course, a £20 flat fee will be charged to cover the cost of refreshments, the venue and administration; this will be in addition to the full course fee when the delegate next attends that particular course.

For courses which are free of charge, any delegate failing to attend, and not cancelling their place in advance, will incur a £10 delegate fee for online courses to cover administration and a £20 delegate fee for face to face courses to cover refreshment and venue costs.

All delegates will be required to sign the course register on arrival. Whilst we will make every effort, we cannot guarantee to accommodate delegates on a course for which they have not booked a place.

In the event that a course has to be cancelled, we will endeavour to give 5 working days' notice of cancellation. Other than in the case of extreme adverse weather conditions, if a course is cancelled within 24 hours of the course start time, we will refund any supply costs incurred. Any claims must be made in writing and must be accompanied by full documentary evidence.

Courses offered to schools by other teams are also advertised within this booklet. Where booking procedures and contact details are different for these courses, this information is contained at the bottom of the course page.

NOTES

Delegate Fees: Whilst we will make every effort not to do so, we reserve the right to increase the delegate fees during the year to reflect any inflationary price increases in either room hire and / or catering.

Where courses indicate that there will be a 10% discount per delegate for two or more bookings on the same course, this refers to multiple bookings on the same date or session (by two or more delegates from the same school)
